4. First Aid Measures

Inhalation: If symptoms of exposure develop, remove to fresh air. Seek medical attention if symptoms persist.

Skin Contact: Rinse skin with plenty of soap and water. If skin irritation develops, seek medical attention.

Eye Contact: Flush eyes with plenty of water. If irritation or other symptoms persist, seek medical attention.

Ingestion: DO NOT induce vomiting. If the victim is fully conscious, have them rinse their mouth with water. Get medical assistance by calling a doctor or poison center. Never give anything by mouth to a person who is unconscious or drowsy.

Most Important Symptoms: Direct eye contact may cause mild irritation. Inhalation of mist or spray may cause mild irritation. Aspiration hazard – may enter the lungs during swallowing or vomiting and cause serious lung damage, which may be fatal. Ingestion may also cause gastrointestinal effects such as nausea, vomiting and diarrhea and central nervous system effects.

Indication of Immediate Medical Attention/Special Treatment: Immediate medical treatment is required for ingestions which may result in an aspiration hazard.

5. Firefighting Measures

Suitable (and Unsuitable) Extinguishing Media: Use dry chemical, carbon dioxide, polar solvent foam, or water spray. Do not point solid streams of water directly into burning oil to avoid spreading of fire.

Specific Hazards Arising from the Chemical: Not classified as flammable or combustible, but will burn under fire conditions. Closed containers may rupture if exposed to extreme heat. Thermal decomposition may yield toxic decomposition products which include alkyl low molecular weight components, COx, SOx, and organic pyrolytic components.

Special Protective Equipment and Precautions for Fire-fighters: Firefighters should wear positive pressure self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing for fires in areas where chemicals are used or stored.

6: Accidental Release Measures

Personal Precautions, Protective Equipment, and Emergency Procedures: Wear appropriate protective equipment. Spilled material will be very slippery. Use caution to prevent slip hazards.

Environmental Precautions: Prevent entry in storm sewers and waterways. Report spill as required by local and national regulations.



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Methods for Containment and Clean-Up: Absorb with an inert material. Collect into a suitable container for disposal. Rinse area with water.

7. Handling and Storage

Precautions for Safe Handling: Avoid contact with eyes, skin and clothing. Wash hands after use. Do not ingest. Keep out of the reach of children.

Empty containers retain product residue and may be hazardous. Do not cut, weld, or drill. Follow all SDS precautions when handling empty containers.
